This spiritual model of nursing, or divine Love in action, is needed more than ever in a world searching for healing and true healthcare.

Sunrise Haven continues to cultivate a well trained, deeply dedicated Christian Science nursing staff. This past year we added three *Journal*-listed nurses to our staff, bringing our total to nineteen, and **all *Journal*-listed!** The Pacific Northwest is blessed by the selfless love and inspired healing ministry that each Christian Science nurse brings to this holy work.

We have witnessed many healings this year at Sunrise Haven. To name a few, these included:

- Overcoming the effects from a fall
- Healing of breathing difficulties

The Mighty Army

Treasurer's Report - Nanette Leatherwood

We rely on divine Love, expressed by each one of you involved in the prayer-based work of Sunrise Haven, to supply what is needed to fulfill our mission and ministry. We are always grateful to see how supply comes through new ways and channels.

Sunrise Haven, like most Christian Science nursing facilities, operates at a deficit. While we're happy to report that we have been able to significantly reduce expenses while maintaining or improving the level of service to patients and guests, operating expenses are still exceeding revenues for services provided. These deficits are primarily offset by contributions and grants.

Even so, Sunrise Haven still experienced ***net deficits*** of ***\$174,057*** for fiscal year 2013 and ***\$230,188*** for fiscal year 2012. We're grateful for reserves of about \$1,000,000 that helped to fund these deficits.

Sunrise Haven is a wonderful resource to Christian Scientists and their families when they need care or spiritual renewal. The facility is

dedicated to providing such care both now and in the future. However, it is clear that in order to do this, help is needed from everyone in the Christian Science community.

We can gain encouragement from the Bible story of Ezekiel and the valley of the dry bones. As Ezekiel listened to God and then joined the bones together in the right order (the ankle bone to the leg bone, etc.), the bones became a mighty army (Ezekiel 37). At Sunrise Haven, we too are listening to God for His direction. Many "bones" need to come together: increased occupancy, continued efficiency in operations and management of expenses, increased contributions and grants, and increased return on investments. The solution to declining occupancy and continuing deficits (and resultant depletion of reserves) is not any single "lone bone." We are grateful for your listening to God and His direction for how you can help support this mighty army dedicated to Christian Science healing and regeneration. ■

Nurturing our Sustainability

The world is seeking effective, available healthcare. The provision for Christian Science nursing facilities, like Sunrise Haven, offers access to Christian Science care and treatment to anyone relying wholeheartedly on prayer for healing. Christian Science nursing stands ready to embrace all mankind with the love of Christ that comforts and protects as it heals and saves.

Some may ask, "Are Christian Science nursing facilities viable and sustainable?" The Association of Organizations for Christian Science Nursing (AOCSN), of which Sunrise Haven is a member, is focusing on this subject. Believe it or not, this group is not talking about how much money is being spent, the size or number of locations, beds, donations, or fees for services. They are talking about divine Love meeting the human need!

The AOCSN's facilities all over the world have identified three characteristics of the sustainable model of a Christian Science nursing facility:

1. Christian Science consistently practiced.
2. Christian Science nursing understood, valued, and practiced.
3. Field engaged –

The word "sustainability" is derived from the Latin *sustinere* (*tenere*, to hold; *sus*, up). *Sustain* can mean maintain, support, preserve, nurture, nourish, tend, cherish, nurse, strengthen. Mary Baker Eddy tells us, "God gives you His spiritual

ideas and in turn, they give you daily supplies" (*Miscellaneous Writings*, p. 307). This infinite supply of spiritual ideas from God sustains and maintains Christian Science nursing and Sunrise Haven's healing mission.

Sunrise Haven's capacity to demonstrate sustainability will deepen and expand as our mission grows in thought and in heart. We are part of the *Manual By-Law* that Mary Baker Eddy envisioned for meeting human needs.

We are enlarging our understanding of Christian Science nursing, its place, history and value. We love sharing what we're learning! This past year, we have been reaching out and visiting churches. At some churches we've explained our healing mission and the blessing of Christian Science nursing. At others we've provided workshops on the spiritual dimension of care. We also hosted a workshop on caring for children and infants. The workshops are inspiring, uplifting experiences for us and for those we visit.
