Pocket Full of Sunshine

s part of my highway commute into Sunrise Haven, I sometimes find myself in what driver's education referred to as a "traffic pocket". This pocket occurs when there are no other vehicles within my vicinity, and it feels like I am part of a marvel no one else is privy to. Of course, this is not the case. Most of us know that traffic pockets occur when clusters of vehicle speeds either increase or decrease in proximity to one's own.

Nonetheless, it is an occurrence that triggers instantaneous joy and contentment within me. Its significance? Even if lasting for only

a moment, it has the power to completely reset whatever attitude I previously possessed prior to the "pocket".

The "pocket" reminds me of the familiar song lyric by Natasha Bedingfield, popular in the early millennium, "got a pocketful of sunshine". The imagery stimulated by this lyric gives magnitude to the impact of the "pocket" because it perfectly illustrates the immediate effect of divine Love on my thought. This effect is like having the sun all to myself, as though I could take it out of my pocket, hold it, and bask in its warmth and the comfort of its light. Like it shines only for me. In essence, it is how

God loves each of us. From my years in Christian Science, what I know is that sharing this light gives far greater impact to my own life and those around me.

Sharing this light can be difficult when its effect with strangers feels unpredictable, such as in heavy traffic. But, when I remind myself that this light represents an impersonal closeness with God, an uninhibited access to the divine that is pure and child-like, it becomes easier. So, when I am in my commute, at work, or anywhere around other people and can conscientiously share this light through my perception of others, I more effectively experience joy and contentment without needing the physical circumstance of the "pocket".

As a reminder to myself, the "pocketful of sunshine" I experience in a moment on the highway can prompt me to let God guide and reset my thought to the all-ness of Love; the closeness of God that is reassuring, immediate, safe, and infinite. I invite you to recognize your next opportunity to feel this "pocketful of sunshine" that is God's love surrounding you.

hese words of Mary Baker Eddy from *Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures* are for everyone as we are called upon each day to reflect the qualities of cheerfulness, orderliness, punctuality, patience, faith, and receptivity to Truth and Love. Our work to exemplify these qualities makes the difference between merely

going through the motions of daily routine, or truly witnessing progress in ourselves and others. One of the

most important aspects of Christian Science nursing is maintaining our willingness to see, acknowledge, and celebrate the healing of humanity. The etymology of the word "demonstrate" can be interpreted as De-Monster! And this is what I see the Christian Science nurse doing- providing the atmosphere of comfort and assurance that would clear out the monsters of fear and doubt. As Mary Baker Eddy tells us on page 215 of *Science and Health*, "So sin and sorrow, disease and death, are the suppositional absence of Life, God, and flee as phantoms of error before truth and love."

I'm so pleased to tell you of the liveliness of our Christian Science nurse training program, and my joy in accompanying students as their practice unfolds. The first step is a one-day workshop, The Spiritual Dimension of Care, which explores the foundation of Christian Science nursing: the Manual By-law, the qualities of a Christian Science nurse quoted above from *Science and Health*, and its basis in the Bible parable of The Good Samaritan.

Financial Report for FY ending September 30, 2022

he financial supply with which Sunrise Haven pursues our vision of "Humanity loved, blessed, healed," is established in divine Mind and manifested each year in generous support from our community. The Bible gives us a firm foundation for our finances when it says, "I know that, whatsoever God doeth, it shall be for ever: nothing can be put to it, nor any thing taken from it." (Eccl. 3:14) With divine Mind as our source, nothing can be put to or taken from Sunrise Haven. It is a complete idea, including all that's necessary to enable Christian Science nurses to fulfill the Church Manual by-law and "take proper care of the sick" (Manual of The Mother Church, p. 49). Our financial report for Fiscal Year 2022 (October 1, 2021 to September 30, 2022) demonstrates this spiritual source of supply.

Total Income: \$1,053,048 Total Expenses: \$1,639,251

Yielded Net Income (Loss): (\$586,203)

Like most Christian Science Nursing facilities, Sunrise Haven operates at a deficit and depends on contributions, grants, bequests and investment income to cover the gap between operating expenses and income from services. Nevertheless, Mary Baker Eddy says Christian Scientists "have no craft that is in danger" (Message for 1901, p. 30) and Sunrise Haven has always been solvent. In past years the growth of our investment accounts has been significant, but the market tumbled in 2022 and the value of our accounts dropped by about 30%, reflected in the total income listed above. Despite that turbulence, the combined income from our services and contributions, excluding the loss of investment income, totaled \$1,602,572 and covered nearly all of our expenses.

The expression of divine Love going on daily at Sunrise Haven is lifting up the lives of our guests, our staff, and the world. You are invited to participate in this spiritual uplift by contributing financially to our tax-exempt organization, and especially by volunteering your time and prayers. We consider you all part of the team providing Christian Science healing to the world, and we're grateful for your support!
